We have a speedskating association in California - the Southern California Association. San Francisco, at this time, is in that association's territory as well as towns in that general area. So you are in good hands! We have some very good people in the Southern California Assn. to help you. The president of the association is very anxious to meet with you and your group and help you in any way he can. He is a coach and at this point has plans to bring a couple of his skaters up to your area to help you with skating techniques and club organization. Jerry will fill you in on how you can join the Amateur Skating Union and the Southern California Assn. When you join the ASU you receive the ASU newsletter, The Racing Blade, and the ASU official Handbook, which includes a great deal of very important speedskating information including all the rules which govern our sport. ASU membership for all first-year registered skaters is free. The second year membership for skaters 15 years old and under is \$10 and all subsequent dues are \$20 per year. Second-year dues for skaters over 15 are \$20. Dues for all nonskaters and officials is \$10 per year. Jerry will have the ASU registration forms for those of you who want to join the National organization.
